We also encourage families to visit the district website for additional information and resources regarding **school safety**. This short video is another helpful resource for families:

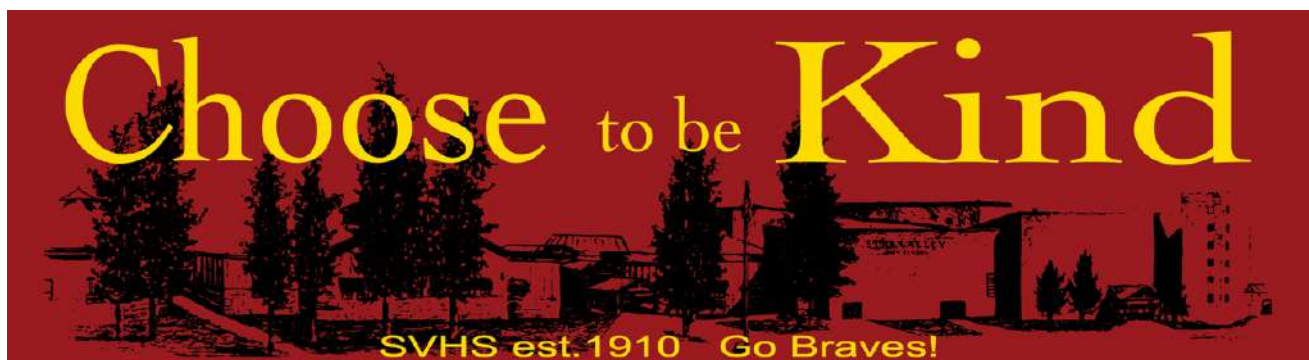

ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Students are expected to attend every class, every day, and arrive on time.

Students are limited to:

9 ABSENCES PER CLASS EACH TRIMESTER

(School-sponsored activities do NOT count toward the 9 absences.)



Regular attendance is essential for academic success and earning course credit.

WHAT HAPPENS AT 10 ABSENCES?

BEFORE MID-TRIMESTER

Students will:

- Be removed from the class
- Receive an Incomplete (I)
- Be considered for an approved online course (course availability permitting)



FRESHMEN & SOPHOMORES
Report to the Library



JUNIORS & SENIORS
May qualify for Off-Campus/Flex

AFTER MID-TRIMESTER



FRESHMEN & SOPHOMORES

- Withdrawn from the course
- Report to the Library or Academic Support
- No credit awarded



JUNIORS & SENIORS

May receive a Flex Period for the remainder of the trimester.



SENIORS (TRIMESTER 3)

Students who are in danger of not graduating because of attendance may be considered for:

- Credit Recovery
- Alternative Graduation Options

(Administrative approval required. Additional course fees may apply.)



ATTENDANCE APPEALS

Appeals are available for:

- Severe or Extended Medical Conditions
- Active 504 Plans
- Active IEPs

APPEALS MUST INCLUDE:

- Parent/Student Appeal Form
- Required Documentation
- Submitted within 10 school days of removal from class

Appeals are reviewed by:



TARDY POLICY

- Students must serve detention the following school day.
- If detention is not served within 3 school days, the tardy converts into an absence for that class.
- Students arriving 15 minutes or more after class begins will be marked Absent.



ATTENDANCE CONSEQUENCES

Students dropped from a class may lose:



Off-Campus Privileges



Flex Period Eligibility (next trimester)



Internship Course Eligibility (next trimester)



Online Course Eligibility (without an approved appeal)



PARENT & STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Monitor attendance regularly
 - Communicate with the school
 - Submit documentation when needed
 - Address attendance concerns early

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY



Dear Parents and Students,

We want to make you aware of an update to the state and district **Personal Electronic Device Policy**. The updated policy can be found on the LCSD#2 website under the **District and School Board** tab. It was addressed at the most recent school board meeting on August 12.

★ KEY POINTS OF THE UPDATED POLICY ★



Electronic devices capable of communication, internet access, data transmission, image capture, recording, or application-based functions must be **non-accessible and turned off, silenced, or placed in a non-transmitting mode** (such as "airplane" mode) **during the instructional block**.



Students may not operate cell phones, smart devices, or other electronic equipment with video, photographic, or recording capabilities in locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other location where doing so **may violate another person's privacy**.



Students may use cell phones, smart devices, and other electronic equipment on campus **before school begins, during passing periods, during lunch, and after school ends**.



There are additional provisions within the policy, but these are some of the key points we want to highlight.

HOW WE WILL IMPLEMENT the Policy

We will provide a **wall caddy** in each classroom for students to store their cell phones **during instructional time**.



Other personal electronic devices, such as smartwatches, earbuds, and similar devices, will also need to be **non-accessible, meaning they should not be on the student's person**, during instructional time.



For our school, instructional time will continue to be **"bell to bell."**



We understand that changes to policies can sometimes bring questions. Parents are always welcome to call the school with any questions or concerns. We value your communication, input, and feedback, and we appreciate your partnership as we work together to support your student's success.
